What prior knowledge should students have?

- To identify and occupy space to support the success of their team.
- Identify and play in different positions of the pitch.
- Pupils have performed skills to pass, shoot and receive with increased accuracy.
- Children have assessed their own performances to find improvements for future games.

What skills will students learn? (Disciplinary Knowledge)

- To dribble the football with both feet at pace and identify space on the pitch to move into.
- Use a variety of techniques to pass the ball with accuracy.
- To shoot a moving ball past a goalkeeper and within a game situation.
- To use a variety of techniques to tackle an opponent.
- Apply a range of tactics in a game situation and adapt them to be successful.

What key knowledge will be taught? (Substantive Knowledge)

- Children will understand the main principles required for attacking and defending in a game of football.
- Apply all football techniques to a game situation.
- Children will understand that they need to work collaboratively with others to be successful at football.
- Be able to recall the key coaching points to support others within the team.
- Analyse the game situation and devise tactics to support the team into being successful.
