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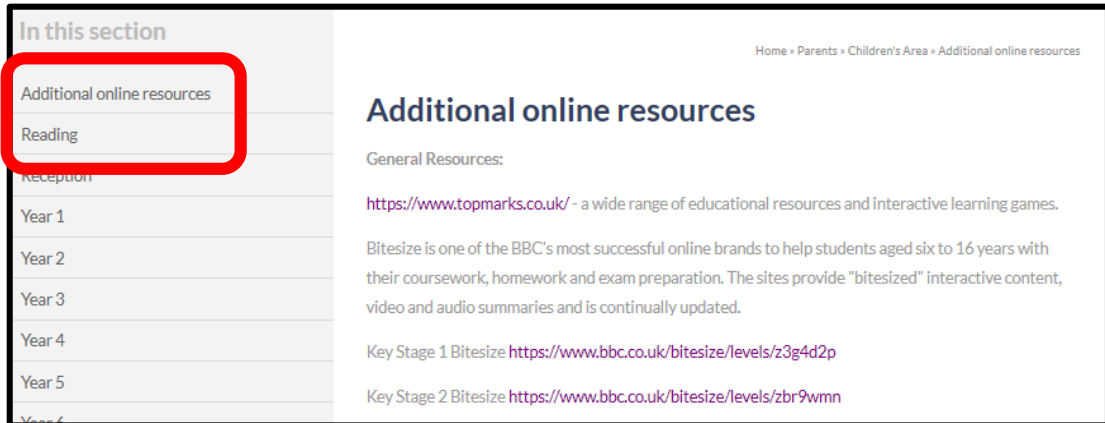

The children will be expected to read for a minimum of 30 minutes per day and support with this can be found within this tab.



Possible questions and answers

What do I do if my child finishes the work assigned within the 'minimum expectation of time spent' stated on the website?

They should then complete the following tasks:

- Assigned tasks in Mathletics. Once these tasks are completed, they are free to explore the platform further.
- Learn the allocated set of spellings on Spellodrome.
- Explore the 'Additional Online Resources' tab found in 'Children's Area'
- Read: we have recommended that whilst your child is at home they are reading for at least 30 minutes a day. This would also include phonics (additional support with this can be found in 'Additional Online Resources'.
- Infant children should choose one of the selected web-links for the correct subject area and complete activities, play the suggested games or watch the suggested learning videos.

How can my child gain access to Mathletics, Spellodrome or Times Table Rockstars?

Your child's log in (Year 1 – 6) is stuck to the inside cover of their exercise book they have brought home.

How will my child's progress be monitored?

Mathletics, Spellodrome and Times Table Rockstars will be monitored remotely by teaching staff. We will be able to track pupils' progress and see how long a child has been using the platform for. We will be able to assign/reassign work to pupils if we feel it is necessary. Infant children can continue to explore these areas, as before, and enjoy the learning activities and games.

The children can also monitor their own progress as follows:

In Mathletics:

In the 'My Progress' section, your child is given all the tools they need to check the progress of their own learning. A visual representation of their results is displayed clearly with a familiar traffic light system. Red activities indicate areas where students need further support, yellow shows that a student is grasping a concept or skill and green areas indicate they have achieved a high level of understanding. To target areas with specific score, student can click the eye icon below the progress bars to view a list of activities with the results in that range.

In Spellodrome:

Pupils can check their progress in 'My Results'. This section shows all the words that the pupil has answered correctly and incorrectly. If the pupil selects the word from the incorrect list it will take them to 'Word Training'. If they then spell this word correctly three times it will move to the correct list. Pupils also keep track of their progress in the 'My Scorecard' section. This will help them see their progress and achievements across all the different areas of Spellodrome.

Children will be expected to bring their exercise book and any work completed back to school when we open.

What if I have an issue with the online learning platforms?

When will the 'Children's Area' be updated?

The web page will be updated with more resources on a week by week basis.

What is a 'Loom' video?

For some of the children's task there will be a 'Loom' video available. This is a pre-recorded video from a member of staff explaining the task set. The children will need a password to view the video, this is 'southfarnham'. We hope this will provide a personal element to the website and be a familiar voice for the children to hear.

How can I support my child with reading?

In the 'Reading' section of 'Children's Area' there are documents which provide support with reading with your child. You will also find links to e-books in 'Additional Online Resources'

Infant children will continue to enjoy Story Time each week with a familiar member of staff taking the role of their much loved Surprise Storyteller. The link for this will be within CLL for Year R and English for Year 1 and Year 2. Please continue to listen to your child read as much as possible and share stories with them too.

What do I do if I cannot access the internet?
