Commas are used to separate things in a **list**. You need **commas** between all the things in the list except the **last two**. You need to put **and** or **or** between the last two things.

I saw gorillas, elephants, zebras **and** lions.

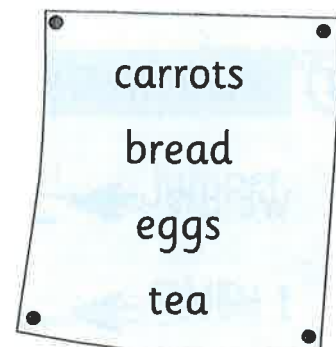
