<u> Home Learning - RE</u>

To understand how Communion is liked to the Passover Festival and to know why Christians today share Communion.

This week in RE, you are going to be looking at why Christians share communion and how it links to other parts of the Christian story through the Bible.

<u>Task 1:</u>

- a) Think back to what you learned before Easter about the Last Supper that Jesus had with his friends - make a mind-map of what you can remember. Watch the video of 'The Last Supper' on the website if you want a reminder.
- b) Make a mind-map using <u>one colour</u> pen or pencil of what you already know (if anything) about communion. You will then add to this later on as you learn more.

<u>Task 2:</u>

Use the communion resource on the website to learn more about the Passover Festival and watch the video called 'God to the Rescue'. Use a different colour pen or pencil to add any notes to your mind-map.

<u>Task 3:</u>

Read on through the communion resource and investigate how communion is celebrated by Christians now. Use a third colour pen or pencil to add to your mind-map. Look at the words from the communion service below and analyse the key words. What do they mean? Why are they important?

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his bloo<u>d which he shed for you.</u> Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

<u>Task 4:</u>

Choose at least one of the following activities to do to demonstrate your learning:

- Create a presentation (in whatever form you like) all about communion. Make sure you like it to both the Passover and the Last Supper.
- Retell or re-enact the story of the Passover (this doesn't have to be written - you could make a video or a voice recording) and explain how it links to the Last Supper and communion.
- Bake some bread and eat it with your family. What does it feel like to share it with them? How does it bring you together? Choose a family memory to share together as you eat it.
- Here are the answers, what could the questions be? The body of Christ
 - Eucharist
 - Wine
 - Create your own quiz like this and challenge a member of your family to create the questions to the answers you give.
