

Pronouns to avoid repetition (I)

Pronouns can take the place of nouns. These can be proper nouns, like names.

- Pronouns: **I, me, you, he, him, she, her, it, we, us, they, them**

We use pronouns to stop us from repeating a noun.

- Sam knew **Sam** was different.
- Sam knew **he** was different.
