Pronouns can take the place of nouns. These can be proper nouns, like names.

 Pronouns: I, me, you, he, him, she, her, it, we, us, they, them

We use pronouns to stop us from repeating a noun.

- Sam knew Sam was different.
- Sam knew he was different.
