- 8. Look at page 75. What was the last thing Otto did to help the younger chicks when they reached the sea? Find and write out the sentence that tells you why he did it.
- **9**. By the end of the story, what <u>four</u> things could Otto do that he couldn't at the beginning?
- 10. What have you learnt about the lives of penguins from reading this story? (You could write about their habitat, feeding habits, parenting and development.)
