The Khanda - a double edged sword.

This represents the belief in one God.



The Chakkar, like the Kara it is a circle representing God without beginning or end and reminding Sikhs to remain within the rule of God.

Two crossed kirpans

(swords) representing spiritual authority and political power.

We understand that this is an important symbol for Sikhs. What symbol could identify you?
