
At the top of the page, there are numerous tabs that access different portions of the website.



Birthday No. 1: If you click on 'Birthday


No. 1', you can discover what tracks were number 1 on your birthday (or the birthdays of your family members) in the UK, USA, Australia, Canada and Germany.

On This Day: From this tab, any day in history can be entered and information regarding that particular day can be researched. It will give you the year and associated artist, along with some information regarding an event.
