Rabbi Zvi visit to Year 5

On an engaging and exciting Friday in September, the four classes of Year 5 each attended a special workshop with the ever-engaging Rabbi Zvi who visited from a synagogue in a local Jewish community. The children were taught about Jewish customs in everyday life such as clothing, prayer, the Sabbath and belief in God which brought their learning in the classroom to life. Each class also had the opportunity to discover what their names would have derived from and they also learnt how Jews sit in a synagogue. The children ended their session by experiencing some Jewish foods which are shared during Shabbat; what a treat! As always, it was a pleasure to listen to the wonderful Rabbi Zvi and his spectacular story telling; we thank him for his visit and look forward to welcoming him back next year.



History

This term, the children have been indulging in many historically related events. Other than their fantastic lessons on historical cultures, such as the Romans, The Tudors and Islamic Civilisation, the children have been able to experience a lot of history first-hand. Year 3 went on a trip to Butser Ancient Farm to experience the ways in which people used to live and take part in some archaeological excavating. Year 4 went on a trip to Fishbourne Roman Palace to see the remains of the famous mosaics and artefacts uncovered there. Year 5 journeyed down to Portsmouth to visit the Mary Rose – having the opportunity to investigate some of the objects discovered at the marine archaeological site and come to their own analytical conclusions. And finally, Year 6 visited the Natural History Museum in London and explored the wonders of that famous building.

Furthermore, all year groups took part in a week-long reflection for Black History Month, during which the children came together in activities designed to help them learn, understand, and celebrate more about black culture, whilst considering the hardships endured by the black

community over the years. From creating African-inspired art to putting their feet into the shoes of Henry 'Box' Brown, every child was able to appreciate and celebrate this community.

And finally, all children and staff took part in the Remembrance Service on Friday 11th November. The entire school fell silent at 11am, following the Last Post, and reflected upon the lives of those affected by and lost due to World War I. Their stories were presented to the school in a theatrical display on the stage in South Farnham School's hall.



This term in History, Year One have been learning all about the history of the school. To further enhance the children's understanding of this topic, Miss Gravestock, a former member of staff, came to talk to the children about what life was like at school for children in the past. During her talk, she amazed the children with wonderful facts such as: why there is a bell in the school office. The bell was originally bought to go in the bell tower, but unfortunately, it was too small. She also talked to the children about all the old fireplaces, which used to keep the children warm before central heating was installed. To prepare for her visit, the children wrote down questions they wanted to ask and were given the opportunity to pose these during the question and answer session. The children

thoroughly enjoyed Miss Gravestock' s visit and learnt an inordinate amount about the history of the school!



On a number of rainy days in early November each of the Year 2 classes visited Aldershot Military Museum. To begin their morning they shared a story about remembrance before completing a variety of activities. These included handling some historical artefacts, investigating war memorials to see who we remember, dressing up to examine the different jobs people had at the time and making their own beautiful poppies. After a quick break, the children then spent some time investigating the life and achievements of Samuel Cody. Following a delicious lunch break, the children then spent time investigating the museum and looking at the numerous vehicles and tanks around the site. Some children even had the opportunity to sit inside some of the vehicles. Beech Class had the very special pleasure of visiting the museum on Remembrance Day. They observed the National silence with the museum staff showing great respect. We were very proud of them all.

Children in Need

On Friday 18th November, South Farnham children took part in a range of Children in Need activities to raise money for an excellent cause. At the Infant Site, this included Pinning the patch on Pudsey, guessing the sweeties in a jar, and giving Pudsey a makeover competition – we had some fantastic entries! In the afternoon, the classes took part in a special 'guess the spotacular staff' quiz which included our wonderful members of staff hidden behind a Pudsey head. Up at the Junior Site we took part in Pudsey design competitions – with many incredible entries, guessing how many skittles in a jar, identifying the Pudsey teacher and a wonderful Strictly Come Dancing competition, showcasing the children's dancing talents. Throughout the week, we held bake sales which included lots of delicious Pudsey themed treats. 

Parents can also request a paper application form or seek help in completing an application via the Surrey Schools & Childcare Service (0300 200 1004, Mon-Fri 9am-5pm). Full information is available on Surrey's website at www.surreycc.gov.uk/primaryadmissions.

Applications received after the closing date without good reason will be treated as late and will not be considered until all on time applications have been processed. This may jeopardise the chance of a parent being offered one of their preferred schools for their child.

Support

ELSA

If you have any concerns about your child's learning or wellbeing then initially contact their class teacher. We operate an open-door policy, but you can also contact staff via the school office. Your class teacher will be happy to arrange a meeting with you and invite other members of staff that they feel would support the conversation. We support children in school in a variety of ways including focus group, personalised learning and interventions aimed to support their academic progress. We also run a variety of small groups to support children's social and emotional needs from social skills and friendship groups to ELSA sessions (emotional literacy support assistant). Following a meeting we will put appropriate support in place in school and signpost children and families to appropriate external services or professionals to provide support.

Young Carers

Earlier in the term we sent a parent mail to raise awareness of young carers and the vital role they play in many families. A young carer is a young person aged 5 – 16 who looks after someone who couldn't manage without their help. This could mean looking after a parent, brother or sister, grandparent or family friend who is ill, frail, disabled or has mental health or drug and alcohol related issues. Young carers often take on practical and/or emotional caring responsibilities that would normally be expected of an adult.

We know that young carers may need a little extra support to enjoy and do well at school. At South Farnham School we are committed to ensuring that all pupils who are young carers are identified and supported effectively. We want to ensure all young carers can enjoy school and make good progress. If you think your child might be a young carer or could be affected by any of the issues we've highlighted, please get in touch with Miss Pearce who would be happy to discuss ways in which we can support your child and family. All contact will be treated in confidence.

Toilets

A few weeks ago, the girls in year 5 and 6 were informed about the sanitary products that are available to them at school. The distinctive white wicker box is always kept in the same place and provides the girls with the sanitary products they may find themselves in need of, from clean underwear to sanitary towels. We explained to the children that they can, of course, bring in their own products but that the box was there if needed.
